our newest chapter, is now a reality. President Bearden asked Mr. Rudolph to be the representative from Phi Beta Mu International and give the oath to the new members.



Those programs are Penn High School: INDIANA, Glenn Northern, director (right) and Westlake High School: TEXAS, Kerry Taylor, director (left).

Each chapter is charged with selecting one best practices of our profession. person from their active membership whose judging experience enables an awareness of the standard to be met for this International award. That could be by chapter vote, selection by chapter officers, any process you feel will nominate a strong representative from your chapter.



Phi Beta Mu is currently accepting nominations to recognize other, exceptional programs in December of 2017. The purpose of the Earl D. Irons Program of Distinction Award is to recognize those bands that exhibit and exemplify the founders' ideals of honoring superior achievement, moral uprightness, and promoting the international development of bands in order to challenge other groups to strive to attain these same levels of achievement.

An Evaluation Committee will be comprised of five Phi Beta Mu members from different chapters, overseen by someone on the International Board or International Executive Officers. Five committee members will be selected by the International Board from the list of names submitted by the individual chapters.

This will create a pool of names from which the five evaluators will be selected. There will be no more than one representative from any single chapter.

Timeline

January - May: Chapters send in the name of their representative for the Evaluation Committee along with a Bio/ Resume that attests to the nominee's qualifications. Send the name and supporting information to Paul Worosello by June 1st.

Beginning of June: International Board selects the panel of five evaluators from the submitted names. Letters are sent notifying the individual and that person's administrator(s) of their selection to this panel and thanking them in advance for their service and time to the fraternity and promotion of the best in bands and

June 1 – August 15: (First Round) Evaluators will have access to MP3 files via Dropbox. Files will be labeled Band A, Band B, etc. to keep bands anonymous. Each evaluator will make a list of those bands they feel meet the highest level of performance of quality concert band literature. Any band receiving at least three votes (of five possible) will move on to the final round of evaluation.

August 15 – November 1: (Final Round) Evaluators will have access to video compilation and supporting documentation via Dropbox for those groups qualifying for the final round. Bands will now be identified, since anonymity will now be impossible to maintain. Judges will evaluate the video compilation and the supporting PDF documentation. Based on this material, each judge will compile a list of bands they feel are deserving of the award. If three or more judges feel a band is deserving, that organization will be honored as an Earl D. Irons Program of Distinction.

Winners will be notified by Nov. 1st with the presentation made during Midwest of that same year.

2016 GENERAL ASSEMBLY MEETING - DAVID LAMBERT

Meeting was called to order at 7:45 AM with 76 in attendance from 14 chapters.

Following the invocation **President** Keith Bearden addressed the membership: "I welcome members of Phi Beta Mu and special guests today. Thank you for making the effort to attend. It is a distinct pleasure and honor to serve as your international president. PhiBetaMu was born in Lubbock, TX six blocks from where I attended school and from where I retired-Texas Tech University. PhiBetaMu holds a special place in my heart and has had a tremendous impact on my career. PhiBeta Mu continues to spread the good news beyond borders as we work with brothers and sisters across the country and around the world.

From time to time, I hear comments such as - "what has Phi Beta Mu done for me all we do is promise and swear". PhiBetaMu is like everything else which is good in life. You get out of it what you put into it. It's like band directing, you get what you expect. What greater joy, if only to see the excitement on a colleague's face as you sponsor them into our fraternity, signalling to them - "you've done well faithful servant". It is important to recognize "stars" in our field, both young and old. The common bond of music binds us all together in fellowship.

President Bearden then introduced the International Executive Secretary, David Lambert (Alpha Chapter) who administered the oath.



President Bearden then addressed old business: He indicated that the board has gleaned a lot of information from information gathered from surveys done by Keith Rudolph, Public Relations Committee, and continues to work on issues addressed in those surveys.

International still has several chapters in

arrears. Secretary Lambert is working on those. President Bearden reminded the membership implemented term limits for all board members that limited them to two three year terms. So, there will be an election every year. <u>Please vote</u>.

Secretary/Treasurer, David Lambert presented the secretary's and financial reports. He reminded the membership that the 2015 financial report is on the International web page and that once the December bank statement arrives, he will send the financials to the accountant and



will post the 2016 financial report to the webpage.

He also reported that the various chapters had presented eight "Outstanding Bandmaster", three "Outstanding Contributor to Bands" and Six "Outstanding Student" awards in the past year.

He reminded chapter presidents and secretaries of the reception at McCormick Place that afternoon.

Past President, Paul Worosello presented information on the Earl D. Irons Program of Distinction Award and introduced the Original Development Committee: Paul Worosello - Chair: ALPHA, TX, Barbara Lambrecht: ALPHA, TX, Cathy Williams: OMICRON, AR, Travis Weller: NU, PA, Joann Hood: ETA, TN.

He also announced the Selection Committee for 2016: Cindy Lansford: AL-PHA, TX, Jackie Gilley: BETA Chapter, OK, Dana Hamant: IOTA Chapter, KS, Thomas Brown: ZETA, GA, Martin Dickey: THETA, SC.

He presented the names of the winning organizations for 2016: Penn High School: Mishawaka, IN | Glenn Northern, Director and Westlake High School: Austin, TX | Kerry Taylor, Director

The Phi Beta Mu Earl D. Irons Program of Distinction is open to all high school band programs. Director must have been at that program for at least the previous five years. Any member may nominate one program. The initial nomination occurs in confidence with the director unaware of the nomination.

Bands may be nominated at any time up to April 30 of the current academic year. Nominations are currently being accepted for the 2017 Award.

Barbara Lambrecht, Outstanding Bandmaster Committee presented her report. She told the membership that the 2016 winner was Colonel Akira Takeda, 13th Commander of the Central Band of the Japan Ground Self-Defense Force, and that he would receive his award at the Awards Breakfast following the General Assembly meeting. She then announced that Jerry Junkin, Director of Bands at the University of Texas, is the winner of the 2017 award.

Cathy Williams, Outstanding Contributor to Bands Committee, announced the 2016 recipient Chip Atwater, Chairman of Amro Music Stores in Memphis, TN. He, too, would receive his award at the Awards Breakfast. She announced the 2017 winner is Dennis Fischer, Associate Director of Wind Studies at the University of North Texas.



2016 General Assembly Meeting - Continued

Rodney Bennett, Constitution Review Committee, reported the constitution revision was completed and approved in 2014. Amendments of term limits and honorary member revisions were approved in December 2015. The addition of language to allow the International Board to conduct business via electronic means between annual meetings was also approved at the December 2015 general assembly. There was no activity on the constitution in 2016.

Dwayne Sagen, Special Projects and Objectives Committee, highlighted the work submitted by various chapters:

DELTA Chapter, MS gave our International Executive permission to upload from their Chapter's Website, a Band Director Instructional Video onto the International PBM Website for all Chapters and members to view and use.

ETA Chapter, TN continues to nominate and choose the Tennessee All State Band Conductors performing at their annual TMEA Convention.

GAMMA Chapter, IN has several ongoing projects including: Mentoring to young (or new to Indiana) band directors; Podium Exchange where members trade a rehearsal with each other's band; and has a committee investigating starting a scholarship program.

LAMBDA Chapter, MO continues to sponsor and select the winner of the Claude T. Smith Memorial Composition Contest. This year they awarded the \$5,000 Prize to Robert Langenfeld of Shawnee, Kansas, for his composition, Spark!

MU ALPHA Chapter, AB, CANADA continues to sponsor a scholarship that supports a young band musician to attend the Canadian National Youth Band. This year's recipient, Jarett Jacobs of Didsbury, AB, a tuba player in his second year, Bachelor of Music program at the University of Lethbridge AB.

Members of MuAlpha are active in providing donations of cash and instruments to Orquestra Escuela de Puerto Vallarta in Puerto Vallarta, Jalisco, Mexico; a project initiated by Brother Barry Valleau.

Members of MuAlpha continue their support of band programs in Dominica, W.I.

NU Chapter, PA continues to support and fund the Nu Chapter Scholarship awarded every year to a music education major. Nu chapter has begun the preparation to commission a piece for jazz band.

PSI Chapter, KY started a new project called the PhiBetaMu Concert Band Festival. Middle and High School Concert Bands across Kentucky were asked to submit applications to be featured performing ensembles at the event. From those applications, two middle school bands and four high school bands were chosen. They each prepare a thirty minute program to perform for an audience, and a featured clinician was there to both provide the students with feedback on the performance as well as to work with the bands on stage, giving the audience a clinic session. This past year, the featured clinician was Ray Cramer, Professor Emeritus from Indiana University. The festival was a huge success, and we have already seen this year a doubling of the amount of applications for our next festival with clinician, Dr. Paula Crider.

ZETA Chapter, GA is currently involved in a commission project with the composer/teacher, Jay Bocook. We commissioned Jay, led by our Brother Rich Bransco, to compose a level five overture. Through donations by our Zeta members and several band booster organizations, this has become a reality. The composition will be performed on Friday, Jan 27, 2017, at our Georgia Music Educators Annual Conference. The Georgia Wind Symphony, adult community band, conducted by Brother David Gregory, will feature "Down By The River," by Jay Bocook.

Keith Rudolph presented the Public Relations Report:

Our chapter profiles provide a thumbnail sketch of each chapter's history, activity, and membership. The profiles have proved to be very popular for those seeking information about our chapters in that the profiles allow members to see and gain inspiration from what other chapters are doing and give non-members who visit the site some insight on how our motto of *Life*, *Love*, *Music* is carried out in our various chapters.

In 2016 nine more chapters submitted a Chapter Profile so we now have information on these twenty-six chapters: Alpha, Texas - Alpha Chi, Virginia - Alpha Gamma, North Dakota - Alpha Theta, Nebraska - Beta, Oklahoma - Beta Zeta, Brazil - Eta, Tennessee - Gamma, Indiana - Iota, Kansas - Kappa, Colorado - Kappa Theta, Minnesota - Lambda, Missouri -Lambda Iota, Ontario - Lambda Zeta, Oregon - Mu, Ohio - Mu Alpha, Alberta - Nu, Pennsylvania - Omicron, Arkansas -Phi, New Mexico - Pi, Wisconsin - Psi, Kentucky - Sigma, South Dakota - Tau, West Virginia - Theta, South Carolina -Xi, Illinois - Zeta, Georgia

Jay Watkins presented the Commission Report - The Grade 1.5 composition written by William Owens entitled The Wings of Mercury is completed. The premiere performance is scheduled for the 2017 Texas Music Educators Association Conference and will be presented by Mineola Middle School, the 2017 TMEA Texas Class C Honor Band, conducted by Melissa Grant Fisher.

Our next commission will be a grade 5 work to be completed by December 2018 with a performance in 2019, hopefully at the Midwest Clinic. The International Chapter has funded the last two commissioned works and now are inviting all PBM chapters to assist with funding who would like to participate in a consortium.

Mike Townsend, presented the Newsletter Report - he said that he survived the first year of producing & editing the Phi Beta Mu International Newsletter! ---It is a time consuming but worthy task and I look forward to 2017. There will be "3 editions in 2017" and encourages all chapters to submit something for at least one edition each year.

Sheryl Bowhay, Website/Social Media Facilitator, presented her report stating that the website continues to be reliable and consistent. It has proven to be a resource for storage of records/documents and archiving information.
