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EARL D. IRONS PROGRAM OF DISTINCTION - PAUL WOROSELLO (Alpha/TX)



After a two-year hiatus, Phi Beta Mu is again accepting nominations for the Earl D. Irons Program of Distinction award. The purpose of the award is to recognize bands that exhibit and exemplify the founders' ideals of honoring superior achievement, moral uprightness, and promoting the international development of bands, and to challenge other groups to strive to attain these same levels of achievement. The award is open to all high school band programs. The Director must have been at that program for at least the previous five years.

Any Phi Beta Mu member may nominate one program. The initial nomination occurs in confidence with the director unaware of the nomination, just as a potential member is nominated for membership to a state/province chapter. (Exception: Member may not nominate their own program, or program in their feeder system.). Nomination form can be downloaded from the Earl D. Irons Program of Distinction link, located on the left side of the International Phi Beta Mu home page.


Nominations will be accepted until April 30 of the current academic year. Note: The earlier the nomination is received, the more time the nominated program has to assemble all required material.

The completed nomination form is emailed to Paul Worosello, (worosell@swbell.net) who, within a week, will notify director of the nomination by sending a letter of congratulations and information on how to proceed. Nominated bands are under no obligation to act upon the nomination.

Director of the nominated school will be notified of the nomination by Phi Beta Mu International. Director of the nominated school is responsible for providing all supporting documentation needed in the selection process. Some video will be required for a representative sampling of the band. All information detailing the nomination and submission process is detailed on the website.

The Executive Board of Phi Beta Mu is dedicated to promoting quality music for the wind band by commissioning new literature that contributes to the existing band repertoire for all grade levels as we work to build better bands. We are pleased to announce that we have commissioned Carol Brittin Chambers as the composer of a new work for wind band. This new composition will be a Grade 3-3.5, and the projected completion date is end of Summer 2022.

Mrs. Chambers is the composer and owner of Aspenwood Music. She lives in San Antonio, Texas, and in addition to composing, she is on the music faculty at Texas Lutheran College.

Carol's compositions include works for concert band, marching band, orchestra and chamber groups alike. Her concert works have been performed at state educators conferences across the country, including The Midwest Clinic. Her compositions are currently on several state prescribed music lists, and that number is growing. Her concert works have been

selected to the JW Pepper Editor's Choice List and Bandworld Top 100, and she was recently named the winner of the WBDI Composition Competition.

Carol's marching band arrangements and orchestrations are frequently performed at BOA competitions throughout the country, including BOA Grand Nationals Finals Championships.

Carol is a graduate of Texas Tech University (Music Education) and Northwestern University (Trumpet performance) and is a former band director and private teacher in the San Antonio area.
